ORDINANCE NO. 01 - 18

THE TOWN OF FOREST HEIGHTS INFRASTRUCTURE BONDS, 2018 SERIES A

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF FOREST HEIGHTS, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND (THE "ISSUER"), PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ONE MILLION FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (**\$1,050,000.00**) OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF FOREST HEIGHTS, MARYLAND, TO BE KNOWN AS "THE TOWN OF FOREST HEIGHTS, INFRASTRUCTURE BONDS, 2018 SERIES A" (OR BY SUCH OTHER OR ADDITIONAL DESIGNATIONS AS REQUIRED BY THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION IDENTIFIED HEREIN) (THE "BONDS"), TO BE ISSUED AND SOLD PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY OF SECTIONS 4-101 THROUGH 4-255 OF THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND, AS AMENDED, FOR THE PURPOSE OF (I) PROVIDING ALL OR A PORTION OF THE FUNDS NECESSARY FOR FINANCING AND/OR REFINANCING ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS, (II) FUNDING A PORTION OF A CAPITAL RESERVE FUND AND (III) PAYING ISSUANCE AND OTHER COSTS RELATED TO THE BONDS; PROVIDING THAT THE BONDS SHALL BE ISSUED UPON THE FULL FAITH AND CREDIT OF THE ISSUER; PROVIDING FOR THE DISBURSEMENT OF THE PROCEEDS OF THE SALE OF THE BONDS AND FOR THE LEVY OF ANNUAL TAXES UPON ALL ASSESSABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE ISSUER FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS AS THEY SHALL RESPECTIVELY MATURE; PROVIDING FOR THE FORM, TENOR, DENOMINATION, MATURITY DATE OR DATES AND OTHER PROVISIONS OF THE BONDS; PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF THE BONDS; AND PROVIDING FOR RELATED PURPOSES, INCLUDING (WITHOUT LIMITATION) THE METHOD OF FIXING THE INTEREST RATE OR RATES TO BE BORNE BY THE BONDS, THE APPROVAL, EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF DOCUMENTS, AGREEMENTS, CERTIFICATES AND INSTRUMENTS AND THE MAKING OF OR PROVIDING FOR THE MAKING OF REPRESENTATIONS AND COVENANTS CONCERNING THE TAX STATUS OF INTEREST ON THE BONDS.

GREETINGS FROM MARYLAND DELEGATE JAY WALKER!

I bring you greetings from Annapolis as the Chair of the House Prince George's County Delegation. Your Delegation has been working hard this session and we are honored to represent the Town of Forest Heights. At the time of writing this, we are around the mid-point of the 90-day legislative session. There is a lot of work left to do - I wanted to take a moment and provide you an update and opportunity for you to engage with your state leaders who serve you.

I consider myself blessed to be able to work on the issues impacting our families and the work we do in Annapolis is important. For example, after years of deliberation and hard work, this session we are finally moving paid sick leave forward. I serve on the Ways and Means Committee and we consider measures to improve public education, opportunities to reexamine tax laws, and oversee Maryland's gaming industry. In addition to my work on the Committee, I was also appointed to the Joint Committee on Gaming Oversight. There is a powerful ongoing conversation about how to make communities like Forest Heights whole when our casinos are earning record revenues each month. I know there is a lot we can do in the future for Forest Heights with powerful partners like MGM, the National Harbor and Rivertowne in the Town's backyard.

Within my Committee, I am also the Chair of the Revenues Subcommittee. We see so many pieces of legislation that we have to divide them among subcommittees to ensure all bills get a fair look from the Delegates. This year, especially, we have a high volume of legislation and a lot to consider. At times, the bills we have before us are complicated government finance bills and I'm grateful for the experience I've had that helps me wade through the intricacies of the new proposals. When I review legislation, I constantly consider how the bills will impact towns like Forest Heights - from the working families trying to make it each month to the seniors who are on fixed incomes - this work is rewarding, yet challenging as well.

I look forward to providing a full update at the conclusion of session to let you know how we fared and what changes you might expect. Please know my door is always open and I encourage you to contact me if you have any questions (email jay.walker@house.state.md.us)

10 things to know about your new Medicare card

Medicare is mailing new Medicare cards starting in April 2018. Here are 10 things to know about your new Medicare card:

- Mailing takes time:** Your card may arrive at a different time than your friend's or neighbor's.
- Destroy your old Medicare card:** Once you get your new Medicare card, destroy your old Medicare card and start using your new card right away.
- Guard your card:** Only give your new Medicare Number to doctors, pharmacists, other health care providers, your insurers, or people you trust to work with Medicare on your behalf.
- Your Medicare Number is unique:** Your card has a new number instead of your Social Security Number. This new number is unique to you.
- Your new card is paper:** Paper cards are easier for many providers to use and copy, and they save taxpayers a lot of money. Plus, you can print your own replacement card if you need one!
- Keep your new card with you:** Carry your new card and show it to your health care providers when you need care.
- Your doctor knows it's coming:** Doctors, other health care facilities and providers will ask for your new Medicare card when you need care.
- You can find your number:** If you forget your new card, your doctor or other health care provider may be able to look up your Medicare Number online.
- Keep your Medicare Advantage Card:** If you're in a Medicare Advantage Plan (like an HMO or PPO), your Medicare Advantage Plan ID card is your main card for Medicare – you should still keep and use it whenever you need care. However, you also may be asked to show your new Medicare card, so you should carry this card too.
- Help is available:** If you don't get your new Medicare card by April 2019, call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227). TTY users can call 1-877-486-2048.

You have the right to get Medicare information in an accessible format, like large print, Braille, or audio. You also have the right to file a complaint if you feel you've been discriminated against. 10 cosas que debe saber sobre su nueva tarjeta de Medicare

A partir de abril 2018, Medicare estará enviando por correo nuevas tarjetas de Medicare. Aquí hay 10 cosas que debe saber sobre su nueva tarjeta de Medicare:

- El envío por correo toma tiempo:** Su tarjeta puede llegar en una fecha diferente al de su amigo o vecino.
- Destruya su tarjeta anterior de Medicare:** Una vez que reciba su nueva tarjeta de Medicare, destruya su tarjeta anterior de Medicare y empiece a usar su nueva tarjeta de inmediato.
- Guarde su tarjeta:** Sólo comparta su nuevo número de Medicare con médicos, otros proveedores de la salud, sus aseguradoras o personas de su confianza para que trabajen con Medicare a su nombre.
- Su número de Medicare es único:** Su tarjeta tiene un nuevo número en lugar de su número de Seguro Social. Este nuevo número es exclusivo.
- Su nueva tarjeta es en papel:** Las tarjetas de papel son más fáciles de usar y copiar para muchos proveedores, y les ahorran a los contribuyentes una gran cantidad de dinero. Además, ¡puede imprimir su propia tarjeta de reemplazo si la necesita!
- Mantenga consigo su nueva tarjeta:** Lleve su nueva tarjeta y muéstrésela a sus proveedores de la salud cuando necesite cuidado médico.
- Su médico sabe del cambio:** Los médicos, otros centros de cuidado médico y proveedores le pedirán su nueva tarjeta de Medicare cuando necesite cuidado médico.
- Puede encontrar su número:** Si olvida su nueva tarjeta, es posible que usted, su médico u otro proveedor de la salud puedan buscar su número de Medicare en línea.
- Mantenga su tarjeta Medicare Advantage:** Si está en un plan Medicare Advantage (como un HMO o PPO), su tarjeta de identificación del Plan Medicare Advantage es su tarjeta principal de Medicare, aún debe conservarla y usarla cada vez que necesite cuidado. Sin embargo, también es posible que se le pida que muestre su nueva tarjeta de Medicare, por lo que también debe llevar esta tarjeta.
- Hay ayuda disponible:** Si no recibe su nueva tarjeta de Medicare para abril de 2019, llame al 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227). Los usuarios de TTY pueden llamar al 1-877-486-2048.

We Need your Help! Come support the Transportation Senate Bill 516

Important legislation on transportation revenue will soon be heard in the Maryland General Assembly! Senate Bill 516, Transportation – Highway User Revenues – Distribution is scheduled to be heard in the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee on March 7 at 1pm. This bill would restore Municipal Highway User Revenues to counties and municipalities across the state. This means that obsolete distribution will be repealed and municipalities will get the percentage of funds they need to fix local roads. The Maryland Municipal League is encouraging residents to contact their legislators for District 26 (Senator Anthony Muse, Delegates Tony Knotts, Jay Walker, and Kris Valderrama) in support of SB 516. Maryland Tree Law

In Maryland, a property owner may utilize “self-help” to trim back at the property line any tree branches or roots encroaching from an adjoining property. This includes trimming overhanging branches located above the ground that break the imaginary plane located along the property line. The exception is that any trimming of encroaching branches or roots must not be so severe as to threaten the health of the adjoining property owner’s tree or other vegetation. If a tree straddles the property line, it is considered jointly owned by both neighbors and both must agree to any removal or pruning of the boundary line tree, unless the tree immediately presents an unsafe condition. Another exception to the self-help remedy exists with regard to roadside trees. Any person who desires to cut down or trim any roadside tree must apply to either the Maryland Department of Natural Resources or the local government (county or municipality) for a permit. Permits are not required to trim a tree that is uprooted or has branches broken so as to endanger persons or property unless local ordinances state otherwise. Roadside trees are typically located within the unimproved portion of the public right-of-way. However, one should check with the Town and/or a recorded plot to determine the exact location of the property lines. When dealing with dead trees, the owner on whose property the dead tree stands may have a duty to prevent injury to neighbors or passersby where the tree poses a danger. The owner of an urban tree, such as in Forest Heights, typically has a higher legal duty to use reasonable care to protect the safety of others. If an urban property owner had notice or was otherwise made aware of a dangerous tree condition, he or she would be held responsible for any damages or injuries to unsuspecting persons or property caused by fallen dead branches. If the fallen tree or branch occurs without prior notice or occurs to a healthy tree, it is often referred to as an “Act of God” and the owner is typically not considered to be liable.
