This month's Community Spotlight is Ward I resident Jerome Adams.

Mr. Adams, a United States Navy veteran and University of Maryland University College graduate, is a professional scuba diver who belongs to an organization called the Underwater Adventure Seekers (<http://www.uasdivers.org>). UAS is a Washington, D.C.-based organization comprised of recreational divers who are dedicated to the principle of safe diving, physical fitness, volunteerism and environmental conservation. Established in 1959 by Dr. Albert José Jones, the group also subsequently founded the National Association of Black Scuba Divers (<http://www.nabsdivers.org>), and today continues to serve as a role model for other clubs that are under the NABS umbrella. Members, including Mr. Adams, have dived all across the world.

"They say that God has a different color paint brush for the ocean," Mr. Adams said. "Scuba diving a very intimate sport. It's very exhilarating. I always get excited on every dive because you're always hoping to see something new. I've seen stingrays, manta rays, all types of sharks, groupers —just about every fish you can imagine.

Mr. Adams said he also cares deeply about preserving the environment. He and other UAS members regularly volunteer for cleanups of the Anacostia River, and he has been involved with the local Oxon Run stream clean-ups. UAS also hosts community outreach events, including a program called Diving with a Purpose (DWP), which provides youths the opportunity to take part in underwater archaeology education.

He said being a part of UAS has taught him many life skills and lessons.

"There's no such thing as quitting; there are no excuses," he said. "It's also one of those sports where you cannot do it by yourself. You have to have a diving partner with you. You also have to be accountable to everybody. If somebody's in trouble, it's your job to go over there and help them."

Mr. Adams is also passionate about educating youths, and has been specially engaged within the Forest Heights -Oxon Hill community. He underwent training to become Scout Leader for the new Boy Scout Troop in the Town of Forest Heights, and is currently seeking more help and involvement from men in the community.

He is the President and CEO of a local organization called Beating The Bully LLC (www.beatingthebully.net), which he established to help high school students and young adults embrace a more positive way of thinking and seeing the world. He serves as a motivational speaker at schools and churches, and his website provides clothing emblazoned with positive messages.

ORDINANCE CODE SECTION 11.2. Duty to Cut Grass The owner and/or occupants of land to which this ordinance applies shall not allow tall grass or weeds to grow over six inches (6") in height throughout the growing season, including grass and weeds in the right-of-way, and it shall be the duty of all owners and/or occupants of land located in Forest Heights either to cut or otherwise destroy by lawful means all tall grass and weeds, as defined in this ordinance, which are growing upon said property, before they reach a seed-bearing stage, and to prevent said weeds from perpetuating themselves and from becoming a detriment to public health. On an undeveloped lot, tall grass and weeds must be cut back at a distance of at least thirty (30) feet from the roadway so as to allow a clear line of site.

Our health program coordinator Mrs. Charmaine Turner and communications specialist Mimi Liu visited Forest Heights Elementary School May 8 in search of ideas and inspiration for the new tot lot playground in Forest Heights and to get the students excited about their new play space, which will be located at the corner of Mohican Drive and Fox Way. They toured three classrooms — grades kindergarten, 3 and 4 — and asked the students to design what they envisioned for their new play space. The students were able to come up with some great ideas and terrific drawings. We would like to thank Principal Dr. Chester Brookover, our wonderful teachers at FHES and the Forest Heights PTO for having us!



Mrs. Turner and a few Town officials will review the drawings and select a winning drawing from each grade. The winners will be guests of honor at a ribbon cutting ceremony scheduled for the fall and will help to cut the ribbon on the new tot lot.

Last year, Forest Heights was awarded a \$20,000 Let's Play Construction Grant from Dr Pepper Snapple Group and KaBOOM! to fund construction for the new tot lot, a grant that requires a matching fund from the Town and volunteer help from the community to install the new playground. Construction on the new play space will be completed by early September.

Message from Town Administrator

Paper shredding has been rescheduled for June 14, 2014 from 9 am to 3 pm at the lower level of the Town parking lot. It was rescheduled due to a miscommunication between driver of the truck and the shredding company. With all the problems surrounding theft of identity, the shredding program is an ideal way to destroy old records and there is no fee. The Town pays part of the cost and Goode Company pays part of the cost.

We continue to work with the county to correct their storm sewer problem at Seneca Dr. and Woodland Dr. as they own this storm sewer along with several other locations in Forest Heights. They have several contracts to repair storm sewers in the county and are moving as rapidly as they can. They have sent previously out equipment to pump the water to the storm sewer on the other side of the street. They have a contract to repair the storm sewer and project the work will start in May or June.

Pepco is still working with Riggs construction regarding wheel damage to a number of row's in Forest Heights, paving on Arapahoe Dr. has been damaged, and 2 or 3 vehicles on Shoshone Dr. were damaged when sprayed with hydraulic oil when their boom failed.

We will again have major issues with mosquitoes and the key is to not allow water to stand as they lay their eggs (larva) in standing water, wet leaves, cups, and small puddles of water.

The Town has additional trash waste bins available for order please call Vern Haefele at 301-839-1030 to make arrangements. Residents stacking trash on top of a bin will not have their bin picked up and the residents will be fined by code enforcement. Frankly, if we will recycle, we can lower the amount of trash removed from Forest Heights by 40% (68,000 lbs per yr). Furthermore, recycling reduces the amount of trash going into the landfill, which saves you money as the cost of developing a new landfill will cost millions which ultimately is passed to home owners and commercial property owners.

Most of you should have received a letter explaining the National League of Cities warranty service program for your sewer line. The cost will be \$7.94 per month or an annual fee of \$90.40 or you can pay a monthly fee of \$7.94. The water line warranty service letter will be sent out in September or October and the fees will be the same as last year. If you were in the program last year you will be notified by National League of Cities when it is time to renew. We currently have 219 homes in the program. Proposed MGM Casino Design Approved by County Planning Board

On May 8, the Prince George's County Planning Board unanimously approved the Detailed Site Plan (DSP) for the new proposed MGM casino at National Harbor, paving the way for a final vote by the Prince George's County Council this summer. The casino is expected to open by July 2016.

Residents who testified during the public hearing segment were particularly concerned about the "five electronic screens and other building-mounted signs designed to promote the gaming activities at the resort...." which the Planning Board approved with a few requested changes – including dimmers that would be adjustable for daytime and nighttime to limit impact ("MGM National Harbor casino on road to construction in Prince George's with key vote" by Luz Lazo, *The Washington Post*, May 8, 2014).

The Post writes: "The signage, some of which would be visible to drivers on the Beltway, will include a 60-foot-tall, 100-foot-wide and 35-foot-deep video board at the center of the building facing the Potomac River" and "four additional 49-foot-tall, 90-foot-wide and 71-foot-deep video boards: two on both the north and south sides of the building, along National Avenue and Harborview Avenue."


