MAYOR AND COUNCIL  
THE TOWN OF FOREST HEIGHTS  
ORDINANCE NO. 03-20

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF FOREST HEIGHTS, MARYLAND REVISING ARTICLE 15 (PARKING AND TRAFFIC) OF THE TOWN ORDINANCE CODE, BY CHANGING, AMENDING, RENAMING OR RE-ADOPTING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF SAID ARTICLE INCLUDING SECTION 15.3. (AUTHORITY TO ERECT SIGNS REGULATING PARKING AND TRAFFIC) TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN TO INSTALL AND OPERATE TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNAL MONITORING SYSTEMS AT CERTAIN INTERSECTIONS WITHIN THE TOWN AND IMPOSE CERTAIN FINES AND FEES FOR RED LIGHT VIOLATIONS; AND TO AMEND SECTION 15.13 (PENALTIES; FEES) TO PROVIDE FOR A CIVIL PENALTY TO BE ESTABLISHED FOR RED-LIGHT CAMERA VIOLATIONS AND TO AUTHORIZE REGISTRATION FLAGGING AND CERTAIN LATE AND DEBT COLLECTION FEES TO BE ASSESSED OR CHARGED TO SUCH VIOLATIONS INCLUDING PARKING VIOLATIONS; TO MODIFY AND RE-ENUMERATE CERTAIN SUBSECTIONS OF SAID SECTIONS; AND GENERALLY RELATING TO THE COLLECTION OF FINES, FEES AND THE REGULATION OF TRAFFIC AND PARKING WITHIN THE TOWN OF FOREST HEIGHTS.

ORDINANCE NO. 04-20

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF FOREST HEIGHTS, MARYLAND AMENDING ARTICLE 14 (TOWN PUBLIC ETHICS ORDINANCE) OF THE TOWN ORDINANCE CODE, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 14.4 (CONFLICTS OF INTEREST); AND 14.5 (FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE BY ELECTED OFFICIALS AND CANDIDATES) TO APPROVE CERTAIN CHANGES MADE THERETO CONSISTENT WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF HB 879, (ENACTED DURING THE 2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION), INCLUDING CERTAIN CHANGES THAT MUST BE ADOPTED FOR A LOCAL GOVERNMENT TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBTITLE 8 OF THE PUBLIC ETHICS LAW OR COMAR 19A.04 SUCH AS (I) LANGUAGE ADDED TO THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST SECTION COVERING LOCAL ELECTED OFFICIALS PRECLUDED FROM LOBBYING FOR ONE CALENDAR YEAR AFTER LEAVING OFFICE, AND (II) REMOVAL OF HOME ADDRESSES FROM PUBLIC DISCLOSURE FOR LOCAL EMPLOYEES AND ELECTED OFFICIALS ON THEIR FILINGS SUBMITTED AFTER JANUARY 1, 2019 AND CERTAIN OTHER DISCRETIONARY CHANGES; AND GENERALLY RELATING TO THE TOWN'S PUBLIC ETHICS LAW.

## COVID-19 News

### NEW COUNTY COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

The State of Maryland and Prince George's County has seen an increase in the number of COVID-19 cases. County Executive Angela Alsobrooks has extended a modified phase 2. Gathering sizes are limited to 10 indoors and 25 outdoors, or one person or household per 200 square feet.

Masks and face coverings will be required outdoors unless vigorously exercising. This rule applies to everyone aged 5 or older.

- Indoor dining now limited to 25% capacity
- Outdoor dining limited to 50% capacity
- Bowling alleys and gyms limited to 25% capacity
- Retail capped at 50% capacity Essential businesses (grocery stores, specialty food stores, big box stores) and retail stores may operate at 50% capacity but with all safety protocols adhered to

Churches are limited to 125 persons outside or 25% capacity inside.

With cases rising dramatically, it is up to residents to exercise best practices. This may mean not holding holiday celebrations with anyone outside of your immediate household.

### Prince George's County COVID Testing sites

Prince George's County has several permanent testing locations for COVID-19, with pop up locations announced on their website. You can find the locations by going to the website at [princegeorgescountymd.gov](http://princegeorgescountymd.gov) and searching COVID-19 testing. Testing is limited to persons 10 years of age or older. Patients do not need an appointment, doctor's note, or insurance to get tested.

### Student Grab and GO Meals

Prince George's County Public Schools offers FREE meals for all children ages 2 to 18 to be picked up at schools on Mondays and Wednesdays from 10AM-1PM. This includes nearby locations such as Forest Heights Elementary School, Flintstone Elementary School and Oxon Hill High School. Children picking up meals do NOT need to show identification. Parents picking up meals must show student Pin Number, Student ID, or most recent report card to verify enrollment.


